Best of all, Monday night is "Mac 'n Cheese' night!


Friends' Board of Directors - 2015

Playaways

Do you know what a "Playaway" is? Would you like to listen to audio-books when on a cross-country road-trip or during your daily commute, but your car does't have a CD player? Would you like to listen to a best-seller while walking or at the gym but you have mislaid your Walkman (which was too bulky anyway)?

A Playaway is a handy device the size of a cell phone, weighing only 2 ounces, that comes pre-loaded with one audio-book.

The Playaway is equipped with a universal jack, so you can listen in the car, or with your ipod earbuds or any type of headphone.

It can be set to one of five narration speeds so that you can listen at your own pace. Automatic bookmarking remembers where you last took a break.

Check out the Playaway collection at our library. They are housed in bright orange cases and located in the main Fiction Room near the 'Books on CDs' section.
