It is hard to comprehend that another year in the life of our beloved library will soon come to an end. 2018 has been a successful year for us, as each of our activities has exceeded our budgeted income amount. Our membership has increased to 294 from 270 in 2017. We are thrilled with each membership. Thank you for continuing your membership or joining us as a new 2018 member!

We have five directors who are rotating off our board. They have all generously shared their time and talents with our library. They are Mary Armstrong, Steve Bowen, Steve Frank, Tanya Fura, and Sue Larrabee. Each has been an incredible asset and fun to work with. Thank you for serving on the Friends Board.

I hope you have responded to the Board of Trustees' Fund Drive appeal. If you haven't had a chance to do so yet, you can drop your contribution off at the library anytime.

It is wonderful to be part of a small community in which everyone embraces its library. All of you members make our job easier—you support our membership drive, support all our fundraisers, and even bake for our bake sales. Whoever made the lemonade cookies for our summer concert, please make them again next year. They were yummy!!

We help raise money for special programs and items that are not covered by the library's annual budget. At our October meeting, we were able to approve over \$10,000 in funding to the library. We approved an annual family pass to Old Fort Niagara, a *Book Page* subscription that we share with

Ransomville Library, Sunday *New York Times* subscription, replacement of disc cases for DVD's and audiobooks, additional shelving for audiobooks, supplies for the coffee and tea station, new book and newspaper display pieces, and funds for a professional space planning design. Financial Report

2018 is shaping up to be a great financial year for the Friends of the Youngstown Free Library.

Total cash assets are \$25,502, of which \$13,297 are Unrestricted Operating Funds.

Income for the year totals \$17,452 compared to a budget of \$13,390. The extra amounts come from membership dues, donations, our spring and fall book sales, and Dessert in the Stacks.

We paid out \$1,547 in October for wish list items (see Jan Howard's letter above) and \$448 for the library fund drive and newsletter printing and mailing expenses.

Our "profit" year to date is \$8,885.

The fall book sale profit of \$3,006 is the best ever.

Book lovers look forward to the great deals and organization at the Friends' book sales. Families love the children's area, and our shoppers love the complimentary refreshments. Town of Porter Support



In keeping with the Library's mission of community outreach, the event showcased our wonderful asset of the State Park and brought together local members of the community with experienced cyclocross riders from Western New York, Pennsylvania, and Ontario. For a first-time event, there were an incredible 96 riders pre-registered—a healthy number for this type of bike race.

It was a beautiful clear day, and riders started to a backdrop of the Toronto skyline and rode a cross-country race through the trees, down the slopes, and across the beach. Library Director Sonora Miller and spouse Eran kept the riders, family, and community warm with mulled cider and home baked cookies. Fort Niagara generously donated a Family pass to a lucky draw-prize entrant. All profits from both donations and race-entries will go to the Library.
