Hopefully you will find the changes pleasing. Please compliment Jan on her new surroundings!


Mary Andrus 1923 - 2015

Early this summer, Youngstown and in particular the Library Community, mourned the passing of Mary Andrus. Mary was a familiar face to those of us in the village. But her name is particularly special to the Friends of Youngstown Library as Mary was a founding member of the Friends back in the late 1980's. She continued to serve on the Board from the late 80's on and off, thru until the early 2000's.

Her daughter Laura remembers that in the beginning, Mary and fellow-members of the Board, who at the time were mostly Senior Citizens, used to fund-raise by going door-to-door in the neighborhood to ask for donations in support of the library. The Book Sale was also a big fund-raiser then as it is today and Laura remembers her Mother coming to visit her in California bringing with her an empty suitcase, specially so that she could 'remove' books from Laura's bookshelves and bring a full suitcase back to Youngstown packed with books for the sale!

When Mary finally left the Board in 2004, she was presented with an award by the then Board in recognition of all of her efforts and hard work over the years in support of the library, to be named after her - 'The Mary Andrus Award for Outstanding Achievement'. Look for it in the Library today.


Jan was assisted by library page Alicia Hughes, shown to the left with Jan at the start of the event, and also by Trustees throughout the afternoon.


