Board of Trustees Report

The Board has had a busy Spring, mostly taking care of 'governance-type' stuff – bylaw changes, finance reviews and trying to find new streams of guaranteed revenue to put our tiny Library on an assured sound path for our financial future.

We have initiatives on the go to apply for a grant or 2 to spend on sprucing up our technology and getting more stable internet everywhere in our space We are also trying to work on some new fund-raisers for this summer and fall, after holding the ever-popular Electronics Recycling event in June. Thank you to volunteer Lauren Morse for all the hard work you put into this and your creative Easter sugar cookie sale. The Library thrives on having creative and willing volunteers such as Lauren and a few others, so if you have fresh ideas and time to give, please let Sonora know you want to help in some way.

We are also in the planning stages of a BBQ Smoke-Out event at Pat Stack's Somewhere in August, and just in time to fill your freezers we are planning a Meat Raffle in October! That might be a first for a Library!

Most of all we need new volunteers to step forward and commit to being a Trustee of the Library. It may not be glamorous work, sometimes you will find yourself on a policy-review committee or updating the Library's asset list on a spreadsheet, but you will be playing a vital role in keeping our Library and our Community connected and thriving. What a Successful Electronics Fundraiser!

Thank you to everyone who contributed to the Electronics Recycling fundraiser for the Youngstown Free Library! A total of \$947.00 was raised for the Library. Some may wonder why the Library is continually planning fundraisers, when many local libraries never hold fundraising events. It all boils down to funding, which is connected to governance. I'll explain. Every public library in New York falls under one of four categories: municipal, school district, special district, or association. Municipal, school district, and special district libraries are more similar than different, so I'll explain those first.

Municipal libraries (like Niagara Falls Public Library) are funded directly from the city budget whose residents they serve. That means that they are considered another department, and they receive their budget from the city every year. School district public libraries (like North Tonawanda Public Library) cover the residents of the school district. Residents vote on the library's budget the same way they vote on the school budget every year, and the funding comes from taxes levied on households in the school district. Finally, special district libraries (we have none in Niagara County) are libraries whose service area has been specially created by election and then taxes from those residents support the Library. Youngstown Free Library is the fourth of these categories: the association library. Association libraries do not have line-item tax support voted on by its residents. Funding for these libraries varies across the board. For our little library, we receive voluntary funding from the Town of Porter and the Village of Youngstown. This, along with funding at the state and county levels, accounts for 60% of our budget. The remaining 40% of the Library's budget must be raised every year through gifts, grants, and fundraising. That's part of why the Friends of the Library are so essential to the Library; without the Friends' financial support, the Library would not be able to survive.

So, when you're looking at the calendar and wondering "why is there another fundraiser planned for the Library?", now you know. Every person who donates generously to the Library allows it to maintain its place in our vibrant little community.
