The Ruby Carey Memorial Scholarship - DEADLINE: April 25, 2022

BACKGROUND: Ruby Carey was a lifelong giver who donated her time and abilities to her church, community and many civic organizations while raising five children. She was an expert seamstress, was involved in organic gardening and nutrition and loved reading. Ruby helped organize the Youngstown Free Library in 1949 and became a highly valued member of the staff.

PURPOSE: The Ruby Carey Scholarship is designed to honor a deserving graduate who demonstrated some of the attributes exhibited by Ruby Carey through achieving excellence in academics and by giving back to their community. The scholarship is awarded to help them purchase textbooks and required materials in their pursuit of higher education. The Board of Trustees of the Youngstown Free Library and the Board of Directors of the Friends of the Youngstown Free Library are honored to offer this scholarship in her name.

AWARD: An award of \$1500.00 will be presented to the successful candidate upon entering college or university and their name will be added to the Ruby Carey Memorial Scholarship plaque which is displayed in the Youngstown Free Library.

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must reside within the 14174 postal zip code and be graduating High School during the current year.

- Applicants must have a library card in good standing from the NIOGA Library System.
- Applicants must be accepted into and attend an accredited community college, vocational school, college or university within the next twelve months.
- Applications are available at the Library or the Lewiston Porter High School Guidance Office.

Here's how to order:


- Pre-order & pay for your cookie decorating kits at the Youngstown Free Library. \$20 each, payable with cash or check.

2021-2022 Library Fund Drive

The Board of Trustees would like to say a huge Thank You to all of this season's Fund Drive Donors who rose to the challenge and were even more generous than in previous years. By the end of 2021, we had received donations matching the previous year (over \$24,000), but in 2022, we have already logged well over \$10,000!

We would like to recognize those donors listed below and as well as an additional 50 donors who would prefer to remain anonymous.

As mentioned in the President's Fund Drive letter, unlike many other libraries in the area, <u>none</u> of our revenue is generated as a result of you paying your local town or school taxes. The Town of Porter and Village of Youngstown Service Contracts provide funding of \$70,000 and \$1,000 respectively (thank you), and Niagara County (\$5,577) but this reflects only 52% of our budget.

All other funding has to come from gifts, fund-raising events, our partners 'The Friends of Youngstown Free Library', and of course <u>your donations</u>. So far this year, the Library has already jumped into the new year with both feet! The first Winter Reading Program for children ended in mid-January; it was very successful! Fourteen children from ages four to ten read a total of 4,749 minutes during the four-week-long program. Many more children enjoyed the eighty Take & Make craft kits that volunteer Nadine Tidwell created. Many thanks to the Friends of the Library for financially supporting this inaugural program!

What a wonderful book club discussion we had in the first meeting of our Non-Fiction Book Club! This third (and newest!) book club met for the first time in February. In it, participants will meet every other month via Zoom to discuss non-fiction titles in an open and fun debate.

If you are interested in joining, I highly recommend that you read *Think Again:* the power of knowing what you don't know by Adam Grant FIRST. This was the book we discussed in our introductory meeting. So much of this book will be referenced in future meetings because we all so enjoyed what we learned about how to have good discussions when folks have different opinions.

Our next Non-Fiction Book Club will be held on Tuesday, April 5th at 1:30 PM, and we'll be discussing Shakespeare in a Divided America by James Shapiro.

"One District, One Book" season is here again! This year, students are reading The Last of the Really Great Whangdoodles by Julie Andrews Edwards. 
