2023 Friends Membership Drive

Thank you to everyone who has contributed so far to our 2023 Membership Drive. We currently have over 210 Members who have rejoined or newly-joined this year. Thank you so much, but there are still many people out there who don't know how they can help the Library stay strong and active, by joining as a Friend.

The Friends' mission is one of community-outreach and Library-support, by which we mean that nearly every dollar raised is given to the Library to be used to buy those important extras which do not get funded by the Library's Operating Budget. This year we hope to be able to offer \$16,000 to the Library to fund those 'extras' – for example, an 'Old Fort Niagara' pass which you can borrow if you have friends or family in town, additional hard-copy magazines and periodicals, children's activities, a Wi-Fi hotspot to borrow and many, many additional items and services.

The Membership Drive continues all year. Please share this with your neighbor if they are not yet a 'Friend'. Let's see if we can't have a strong membership of 250 members by the year's end.

This will include the interesting display in the upstairs hall of the Lewiston-Youngstown railroad that ran parallel to River Road at the turn of the 20th century.


