A note from Board of Trustees

To the members of the Friends, members, and patrons of the Youngstown Free Library;

I hope that the past summer and fall of 2023 met your expectations and you and your family enjoyed the time you had together. Hopefully, the upcoming winter in western New York will not be too tough and you will be able to enjoy it.

As the end of the financial year approaches, it is necessary for the Board of Trustees to face decisions concerning the budget for 2024. We have already begun work on our budget, our programs and our staffing for 2024. As you are aware, we are an association Library. As such, we do not receive our funding from the taxing process. Rather our funds from the Village of Youngstown, the Town of Porter, and the County of Niagara come from their discretionary spending. These funds account for about 70% of our operating budget and are primarily used to pay the costs of our staffing. The remaining amount of our operating budget comes from grants, the Friends of the Youngstown Free Library, and from you, our friends and patrons, through the Annual Fund Drive.

Grants which we received this year enabled us to maintain our Summer Reading Challenge, the Story Book Walk on Friday nights in Falkner Park, and the Take and Make projects.

The Friends of the Youngstown Free Library have made a substantial contribution to allow the Ruby Carey Scholarship, which the Board of Trustees awards to a graduating senior in the 14174-zip code, to double in amount to \$1,500. This privately funded award recognizes excellence in scholarship, community service and recognizes the importance of the library in the community. The recipient this year was Brynn Townsend.

In addition, the money pledged each year by the Friends makes it possible for the Library to purchase newspapers, other subscriptions, magazines, books and necessary hardware. Without these funds, our offerings and our collections would not be able to meet the needs of our patrons.

The funds raised through the Annual Fund Drive allow us to maintain our NIOGA services and circulation resources. It also has enabled us to expand our Hoopla and Libby digital services. These programs allow our patrons to take advantage of the digital offerings that are ever increasing and that more and more patrons want and use.

I would be remiss if I failed to mention the important role our valued Library staff plays. They are the 'face' of the Library and they are the people who answer your questions about the computers, help you find items in our stacks, reserve materials through the NIOGA system and help make the library a friendly and welcoming place. Without them, especially the Director, Sonora, we wouldn't be able to even open the doors.

The 2024 Annual Fund Drive started during the month of October. I sincerely hope you were able to respond. No amount is too small. As always you can make a secure contribution online by going to our Library website.

Christmas Shopping at the Library!

Have you checked out our Nearly New Book Sale yet? It's the Library's yearround mini-book sale of books that are brand new, and every book is only \$1! These books are perfect for holiday gifts, vacation reads, traveling, and hostess gifts, and your purchases benefit our tiny Library (which relies on gifts, grants, and the Friends' donations for 40% of our budget).



<u>As the Days Shorten, Check Out a Light Therapy Kit to Fight Seasonal Affective Disorder</u> As we move into fall and winter, we lose daylight as the days shorten. Does your mood get affected by the loss of daylight?

Many folks suffer from Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD) from this loss of daylight. Sometimes called the "winter blues," SAD can cause fatigue and depressive feelings. SAD is not very well understood, but scientists are unraveling its connection with sunlight and the production of serotonin and overproduction of melatonin.

According to the Mayo Clinic, "a light therapy box mimics outdoor light. It's thought that this type of light may cause a chemical change in the brain that lifts your mood and eases other symptoms of SAD, such as being tired most of the time and sleeping too much. Generally, the light box should:

- · Provide an exposure to 10,000 lux of light
- Produce as little UV light as possible

Typical recommendations include using the light box:


- Within the first hour of waking up in the morning
- For about 20 to 30 minutes
- About 16 to 24 inches (41 to 61 centimeters) from your face, but follow the manufacturer's instructions about distance
- With eyes open, but not looking directly at the light" (<u>https://www.mayoclinic.org/diseases-</u> conditions/seasonal-affective-disorder/in-depth/seasonal-affective-disordertreatment/ART-200482982p=1).

Thanks to a grant from Humanities NY, the Youngstown Free Library has four light therapy kits that are available for loan to patrons. When you check out a kit, you'll get an easy-to-use 10,000 lux light box and instruction booklet for four weeks. You could enjoy your morning coffee in front of the light box for a month courtesy of the Library!

Keep in mind: light boxes aren't regulated by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for SAD treatment, but we recommend that you talk to your doctor before checking out a kit in case it's not a good match for your body.






Labor Day 2023 It's always a fun time marching in the parade, and this year was no exception!
